

1. Lower Merion PD report/update
 - Information on summer vacation coverage was provided from the Crime Prevention Unit; notice that when you go away, notify the police and they will keep an eye on your property. (anyone who missed the meeting can contact the PVCA or the police department for copies of this information, or pick it up at the June 20 meeting).
 - Reminder to sign up at www.nixle.com to receive special alerts from LMPD
 - Update on recent activity in the last quarter:
 - On CSH in Gladwyne, 2 burglaries.
 - Thefts from vehicles on Maple Crest in early April
 - Thefts from vehicles in Wynnewood and Glenwood
 - The rash of daytime burglaries had slowed, with the exception of today, when there were two additional residential burglaries occurred today in the area (Trevor Lane, and on Oxford Road)
 - Discussion of “Lock for Life” a service available to elderly people in which the local police will respond to a call from an elderly resident and access a special key
 - Reminder that if you see something unusual, call the police, who would rather have an unnecessary call than not
2. Update from Steve Selinger about the Cynwyd Trail, and hopes that in future we will be able to hold a meeting at the new train station as planned for some time.
 - a. Suggestion from one resident that it would be ideal if we had more safe bike routes in Penn Valley
3. Discussion about Montgomery Avenue and the poor quality of the sidewalks along Montgomery Avenue and the encroaching bushes; note that Mark Taylor did notify relevant township employees about this following the last PVCA meeting
